Pastor's Letter

Beloved Community,

As we reflect on the past year at St. Stephen, we are filled with gratitude for the many blessings and accomplishments we have experienced together. It has been a busy year, and yet it is hard to believe that it is over!

One of the significant highlights of the year was our involvement in shepherding St. Luke's during their transition after closure. We are delighted to welcome 11 former members of St. Luke's who have joined our



congregation. They have actively participated in worship, educational opportunities, and various ministries, enriching our community. We are also grateful for the legacy gift of \$117,412 from the assets of St. Luke's.

In terms of ministerial acts, we celebrated the baptism of 2 children and confirmed Logan James Flannary-Miller and Nicolas Anthony France. We also mourned the passing of 4 beloved members of our congregation - Odessa Lemley, Barbara Cibak, Robert Collins, and Lois Gorman. Special thanks go to the Worship and Music committee, led by Eloise Newton, Pastor Nancy Nardi and Pastor Dámaris Porsch-Ortega, for their dedication and support, especially during my parental leave after the birth of my daughter Lily Kacy Janák.

Our lay leadership has grown stronger in various areas. Linda Nietman, Yuan Yuan Yao, and Effil Hemmings have contributed significantly to the expansion of our visitation ministry, ensuring that communion is brought to the homes and care facilities of our members. Advent activities, including wreath making, were led by lay members of our community, and we had a successful spaghetti dinner evening thanks to the social ministry. We have also been able to increase the number of after-worship coffee fellowships.

Over the summer, we had engaging "pub theology" sessions at KC's Korner and continued our studies through Zoom. I am grateful for the opportunity to present a paper at an international doctoral seminar in Prague. My doctoral studies have progressed well, and I am excited to enter the next phase in the first half of 2024.

In 2023, I attended two First Call Theological Education retreats and look forward to the upcoming retreat in Spring 2024. I also had the privilege of co-leading anti-bias and anti-racism awareness trainings in partnership with the Connecticut Diocese of the Episcopal Church in America and the Metropolitan New York Synod of ELCA, through Kaleidoscope Institute.

As we look ahead, I am excited to offer a "Faith Refresher" educational opportunity on Zoom on Saturdays, Jan. 27, Feb. 3, and Feb. 10. Additionally, we are planning meaningful educational opportunities for Lent, building on the success of previous years. There is so much to anticipate, and we are grateful for your continued generosity in many ways.

From the Council President

December was a busy month for our church. Our community outreach is normally focused on our monthly Pop-Up Food Pantry, but Christmas gifts were also donated in December to be distributed to families in South Plainfield. If you missed it, fear not, you can make a donation next year. The Church was decorated in anticipation of celebrating Christmas and two services were held to celebrate. A first-ever St. Stephen's coral group visited a number of homes to sing Christmas carols to help share the season's joy. It was likely a busy time for most of you as well. We welcome any suggestions on how St. Stephen can expand and/or improve our community and world outreach.

The Church Council meeting was held one week earlier than usual to avoid the Christmas week rush. A brief summary follows:

President/ Evangelism/ Finance Reports: We followed up with the NJ Synod to on our revised Constitution and Bylaws. Evangelism provided groceries, personal items, and baby diapers to about fifty families who visit our Pop-Up Food Pantry. A gift made to St. Stephen by St. Luke out of proceeds from the sale of their property, together with other church funds, was invested in a six-month CD to earn a better rate of return.

Treasurer's Report: After covering all 2023 expenses, our congregation ended the year with a checking account balance of \$314. Thank you to all who contributed your time, talents and resources to make 2023 another successful year as we expand our outreach.

Financial Secretary's Report: Financial income records matched the deposit records.

Worship and Music's Report: Will be meeting in January to plan Lenten services.

Social Ministry's Report: Organized the toy collection drive. January's meeting will plan their 2024 agenda.

Property's Report: Work on the church grounds and building continued through regular attention. New doors were installed in the parsonage. A Charlie George Landscaping cleaned the yard and removed the leaves.

Liaison's Report: Randy Gerling has stepped down as our Church's Liaison Chairperson after 20 (?) years of holding that position. Jim Deene, a new Council Member effective in January, 2024 has volunteered to accept that position. A letter was sent to Adonai Christian Center, a church who also uses our building, asking for a meeting to address recurring issues. A meeting was held with that church's Pastor. Solutions to those issues and possible penalties for continued recurrence were discussed.

Discipleship's Report: A workflow to ensure that new members would receive donation envelopes was discussed. Thirty-one pledges for 2024 totaling 113,752 were received continue to be received. In January we will talk about New Year's Intentions. People will choose a quality to really pay attention to in the new year in our interactions with family, friends and strangers. Qualities could be patience, compassion, kindness, etc.

Mutual Ministry's Report: The committee discussed 2023 with Pastor Frantisek. Suggestions from the committee and congregation on changes in process were discussed. Pastor Frantisek was open to the discussion and will implement most suggestions where practical. He also shared a concern about a scam that might impact members.

Technology's Report: Website tracking continues to show a positive trend (more persons viewing). Photo views consistently outpace video "views". Research on a new church accounting, record-keeping package continues. Work on tweaking the sound system is also ongoing.

Old Business:

Council is still gathering ideas for improvements that would be purchased through the money donated by St. Luke. Craig, a member of St. Luke was involved in the disposition of the sale proceeds. He reports that donations were already made to institutions such as NJ Synod, Crossroads Ministry, etc. The money was anticipated to purchase non-recurring items that might have been postponed due to cost.

Suggestions have included:

- Window sills around small windows each side of the alter.
- Concreate work on steps
- The Church's flat roof needs to be coated with waterproofing.
- A handicap-accessible bathroom
- New handicap entrance.
- New flooring for education rooms.
- Member/ Friends list is being worked on.

New Business:

- A new member, Barbara White Stevens was approved.
- Devotions prior to Council were suggested tabled till new Council begins in January.
- Luminaries on Christmas Eve approved.
- Bulletin Board updates discussed.
- Peggy Flannary and Mary Lynn Yurchak were thanked for their time on Council.

From the Discipleship Committee

As I sit down to write this article, all the Christmas decorations are not yet put away, and many of us are still working on our goals and plans for the New Year. Yet, I realized that the focus of this article needs to be Lent. Lent? Already? It seems that the mad rush of the seasons that Pastor talked about on the 4th Sunday of Advent/Christmas Eve, is continuing headlong into the New Year.

I can just hear God saying to us, "time will not wait. While to me, 'One day is like a thousand years and 1000 years like one day,' to *you*, time is precious. You need to <u>use</u> it and <u>enjoy</u> it NOW while it is here. Use it and enjoy it by doing what is most important - growing closer to me and working with your brothers and sisters to do whatever you can to bring my Kingdom of Love to the world."

Lent is a perfect time for thoughtful, prayerful reflection on just how to go about doing this. Take time to ask yourself, "How can I grow closer to God? What is the part He wants me to play in bringing his love to others?"

If you have picked a "Word of Intention" for yourself for this year, Lent would be a good time for examining how your word relates to these two pillars of Lent: 1) Becoming so enveloped in God's Love, 2) that you just *have to* share it with others. How this plays out in your life is unique to you, for God honors your individuality. He is, after all, the Source of all your special qualities and talents. So, talk it over with God and see what you come up with. I have found that making a plan without him, no matter how involved and high-minded, doesn't really work.

The Discipleship Committee will offer some tools to help you, but the work is yours. (And it <u>is</u> work.) We will have devotional materials, and will do Prayer Partners. If you have any questions about either of these, please ask a member of the committee. But remember, these are TOOLS to help you, not ends in themselves. The end, of course, is as the beginning - Jesus Christ, the Alpha and the Omega.
